ENROLLMENT COMMITTEE UPDATE

We understand that there has been some misinformation being stated about the ongoing enrollment reviews. To help clarify some of the questions and concerns, we wanted to give you a quick update.

As of today, we have a total of 298 approved members of the Modoc Nation.

37 letters have been sent out to individuals that are descendants of Modoc Indians on the 1878 Quapaw Agency Modoc Census of Subsistence and Ration but are needing to provide additional documentation to meet the enrollment requirements.

222 letters have been sent out to individuals that have been asked to provide additional documentation to show they are a descendant of a Modoc Indian on the 1878 Quapaw Agency Modoc Census of Subsistence and Ration other than Charley Miller.

Regarding the questions surrounding Modoc Indian Miller's Charley, aka "Charlie Miller", aka "Charley Miller". The historical record reveals that Miller's Charley was a Modoc Indian. All documents confirm that Miller's Charley, aka "Charlie Miller", aka "Charley Miller" died without issue (no lineal heirs) so there cannot be any lineal descendants to Miller's Charley on the 1878 Quapaw Agency Modoc Census of Subsistence and Ration. This has been verified under a thorough review of historical documents and confirmed by an independent historian with expertise in Native American affairs. **See the Department of Interior's filing from June 29, 1914, pictured below.**

No members have been disenrolled with the Modoc Nation. For more detailed information on these issues and other updates regarding enrollment join us at our next enrollment committee meeting on **July 6 at 6:00pm CST.**

Estate of Charley Miller

Respectfully submitted to the Secretary of the Interior, recommending finding herewith, as in accordance with the laws of Oklahoma

It appears from the evidence adduced at the hearing that **the allottee died intestate** April 9, 1911 **At the age of about 75 years, unmarried at the time of his death and without issue, father or mother, brother or sister or descendants thereof.**

Under the provisions of the Oklahoma law of descent his nearest collateral relatives became his heirs. These were the grandchildren of a deceased sister of his deceased father and the grandchildren of a deceased brother of his deceased mother, who thus became entitled to inherit in his estate, both real and personal ^{as} follows:

Mary Chil-lo-quin, granddaughter of predeceased sister of predeceased father 1/7

Mary Turner, granddaughter of predeceased brother of predeceased mother 1/7

May Turner, granddaughter of predeceased brother of predeceased mother 1/7

Anna Skeen, granddaughter of predeceased brother of predeceased mother 1/7

Homer Hutchinson, grandson of predeceased brother of predeceased mother 1/7

Anthur Chester, grandson of predeceased brother of predeceased mother 1/7

Amanda Riddle, granddaughter of predeceased
brother of predeceased mother
